

Interviewing



- Plan your questions
- Closed-ended v. open-ended questions
- Icebreakers
- Non-threatening order
- Control the interview; slow the speaker down with closed-ended follow-up questions
- Repeat questions; ask follow-ups
- Listen; don't judge
- Read Rich, pp. 107-124 and 145-153

G-O-A-L-S

- G=Goals, dreams, objectives
- O=Obstacles to those dreams
- A=Actual achievements; what has really been accomplished so far
- L=Logistics; that is, planning, resources needed to make the dream happen
- S=Starts; that is, where did the dream come from, how did it begin
